Frequently Asked Questions – Erasmus+ for Study (second call)

1. I have been assigned a mobility period from the first call of the Erasmus+ for Studies Call 2025/26. Can I also apply to the second call?

Students who have already been assigned a mobility period under the Erasmus+ for Studies programme (first call) cannot apply unless they have already renounced that period.

2. I have been selected for the Overseas Exchange programme. Can I take part in the second Erasmus+ for Studies call?

Yes, you can apply, but the second call only allows for mobility during the second semester. If you have already been assigned an Overseas mobility in the second semester, you must give up one of the two periods. If you are going abroad with the Overseas programme in the first semester, make sure that the start date of the Erasmus mobility does not overlap with your previous one. Mobility periods cannot overlap.

3. I applied for the Erasmus+ Traineeship programme. Can I also apply for the second Erasmus+ for Studies call?

Yes, you can. However, the two mobility periods cannot overlap. If they do, you will need to renounce one of them.

4. What is the allowed mobility period under the second call?

The second call allows for a mobility period during the second semester only, up to and no later than **30 September 2026**. Students must refer only to the academic calendar of their chosen host universities for the second semester.

5. What is my study area?

You can check your study area in the file available on the <u>Participate in Erasmus+ for Study</u> page.

Please read the documents carefully, paying special attention to deadlines and instructions to ensure a correct application

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6. Can I apply solely for thesis research?

Yes, you may apply with this purpose. However, it is your responsibility to ensure that the three host universities you list in your application form accept thesis research only. Some universities may require additional workshops/seminars, some may ask you to attend courses, and others may not accept thesis work activities.

7. If the host university accepts thesis work only, can I leave whenever I want?

No. You must follow the academic calendar and any guidelines provided by the host university.

8. Can I apply solely for an internship?


Since the internship must be an integral part of your study programme, it is rarely accepted by host institutions, and many do not allow it at all. If you wish to carry out an internship only, we recommend applying for the <u>Erasmus+ Traineeship programme</u> instead.

9. If I apply, can I withdraw?

Yes, you can. Please send your withdrawal request to: outgoing.mobility@unipv.it.

10. How do I submit my application?

You can apply by accessing the dedicated form in **Mobility Online**. The link is available on the *Participate in Erasmus+ for Study* page.



11. How many host institutions can I choose?

You can choose up to 3 institutions, in order of preference.

12. I would like to change the order of preference for my selected institutions. Is that possible?

No. Once you have submitted your application, you cannot make changes to the preference order.

13. How can I find out which institutions are available for my degree programme?

On the <u>Participate in Erasmus+ for Study</u> page you will find the list of destinations for the second call, sorted by study area. Identify your study area and download the relevant list.


Additionally, the dropdown menu on the application page on Mobility Online will only show institutions with an active agreement in place.

Please note: the fact that an institution is available for your degree programme does not guarantee that it offers suitable academic content. Always check in advance the available courses, the language of instruction, and any restrictions (e.g. some courses may not be open to exchange students).

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14. What do "Language 1" and "Language 2" mean in the destination list file?

They refer to the languages of instruction at the host university. You do not need to know both to apply, but you must ensure that you have sufficient knowledge of at least one and that there are enough course offerings in that language.

15. I noticed a mismatch between the destinations listed in the file and those available in Mobility Online. What should I do?

Please report the issue immediately to: outgoing.mobility@unipv.it. Describe the problem and attach screenshots if necessary.

18. I completed my registration on Mobility Online but didn't receive the confirmation email. What should I do?

First, check your spam folder. The email subject is: "COMPULSORY registration for Erasmus for Study for a.y. 2025/26."

If you still can't find it, contact outgoing.mobility@unipv.it for assistance.

19. How do I know if I'm exempt from the language tests?

Exemptions based on your degree program apply only to English. **Annex II of the Call** lists all eligible degree programs and certifications, along with the corresponding English level. **Note**: Exemption allows you to be assigned to a university where the language requirement is met, but **does not guarantee automatic acceptance**. Always check the host university's language requirements and course offerings.

20. Can I register for multiple language tests?

Yes, you can. You may request to take tests for multiple languages, especially if the host university lists more than one language of instruction.

Note: Just like with exemptions, passing a language test allows you to be assigned to an institution where the language requirement is met, but it does **not guarantee acceptance**. Check whether the host university requires specific certifications and whether it offers enough courses in your language of competence. The test does **not replace any international certifications** required by the host.

21. How do I register for the language tests?

Your name and selected languages will be forwarded to the University Language Centre, which will include you in its registration lists.

22. I didn't upload my language certificate to Mobility Online before submitting my application. Can I still add it?

No. You cannot reopen a submitted application to upload documents. Wait for your application to be reviewed and for the completeness/incompleteness email.

23. I was selected in the first Erasmus+ for Studies call. Can I take the language test without applying for the second call?

No. Registration for the University Language Centre tests is integrated into the application form for the specific call.

24. I took an English (or other language) exam included in my study plan. Can it count as proof of language knowledge?

No, it cannot be used as a reason for exemption from the language tests.

25. What documents are needed for the fewer opportunities status?

Carefully read the Call to check if you qualify for this status – **note that this is different from the ISEE-based "family status."** Document verification for additional grant eligibility will be carried out **after selection**. Students who selected this status in the application will be contacted directly by the office.

26. What documents are required to apply for the financial situation grant (Contribution D) based on ISEE?

None. Your ISEE value is automatically retrieved from the Esse3 platform, based on the ISEE you submitted upon enrolment for the academic year 2024/25.

27. I'm enrolled in a Master's Degree, do I need to submit the supervisor's support letter?

No. Those enrolled in a Master's Degree (Laurea Magistrale) do not need to upload the letter from the supervisor.
